Should the DJ attend? (big question).....YES! If possible. (some DJs won't). It may cost a bit more, but it's worth it. If the (particular) DJ has done many ceremonies at the venue in the exact same spot your ceremony will be, he/she will not need to come. However, as brides and grooms you'll want to be sure you've chosen music that works as far as timing. You'll also want to do a full bridal party walk-through with music; a full rehearsal.

A full rehearsal with your DJ can iron details and problems, avoid confusion, give you piece of mind and calm your nerves☺

If your DJ cannot attend, make sure all involved understand the musical cues, timing, & mic usage. Your bridal party should know their walking song/track. Remember, a processional is a slower walk (the photos come out better that way too).

Ceremony Music

Prelude: -gentle, instrumentals or love songs (as guests are arriving)

Processional: easy, slower tunes for bridal party and bride to walk to.
Examples: Bridal March (Lohengrin) or tunes by Vitamin String Quartet, The Piano Guys, etc.

Recessional: more upbeat, celebratory tune(s)
